

Death Notice: Emma Porter Kendall
Telegram [Worcester] Nov. 14, 1900

STERLING – Nov.14, 1900, Rev. Mr. Snapp occupied the pulpit yesterday, and William D. Kendall of Worcester addressed the Unity Guild that night.

The body of Mrs. Emma Porter Kendall, widow of Samuel Kendall, formerly of Sterling, was brought to Sterling this afternoon for burial in Oakhill cemetery. Mrs. Kendall was a daughter of Capt. John Porter, one of the early residents of Sterling, and was born at the place now owned and occupied by Harlin W. Kingsbury, near East Waushacum lake in the year 1807 and was 94 years and 7 days old. She married Samuel Kendall who was also from a Sterling family, a brother of Harvey Kendall. She had not resided in Sterling for many years and died at the home of a granddaughter in Newtonville.

Burial was in the family lot in Oakhill cemetery where the body of her husband lies.

Mrs. Kendall leaves one son, Amory Kendall.
